<p>Public Comments: Mrs. Pamela DeHate inquired about why the cost of the special assessment is based on the taxable value of the property. Mr. Mark Turrow discussed the ISO ratings of the Memphis and Emmett Fire Departments, and expressed his support of the special assessment. Mr. Mark DeHate inquired about which tax bill the assessment would be put on, Rhein stated that it would be put on the summer tax bill. Mrs. Pattie Holland inquired how often the special assessment cost with be raised. Rhein stated there would be a public hearing every year in order to renew the special assessment. Mrs. Florence Sawicki expressed her strong support of the special assessment. Mrs. Suzanne Povinelli stated that she and her husband are both in support of the special assessment, and inquired as to whether the EMS is included in the special assessment. Jeff White stated that it is not, discussion followed. Mrs. Linda Dalecki commented that she is not in support. Mr. Art Mathis stated that he does not support the special assessment. Mrs. Midge St. Ange commented that she is in support, and that she thinks that the special assessment is a much better idea than the current billing system. Mr. Doug Dudek expressed his support, and inquired about the taxable value of Riley Township. Mr. Doug Wendland asked for clarification as to what exactly would be covered under the special assessment. Mr. John Holland inquired how much income would be generated from the special assessment. Rhein stated that approximately \$35,000 per year would be generated, which is approximately one-third of the total price of the contracts with Memphis Fire Department and Emmett Fire Department. Mrs. Carol Miller asked for clarification as to how the cost of the assessment per resident is calculated. Roxy Mateik asked whether the special assessment would be put to a vote by the residents. Discussion followed. Mrs. Deborah Kreuger expressed her support for the special assessment.
