

<p>Open Hearing: Hagle motioned to open the hearing at 6:02 p.m., seconded by Sawicki-Franz. All in favor, motion carried.</p>	<p>Open Hearing</p>
<p>Public Comments: Mrs. Nancy Dudek inquired as to what, if anything would cause the cost of the special assessment to increase. Mrs. Janet Senkow inquired as to if the special assessment passes, then would residents still receive individual bills. Mr. Mark Turo asked the board to explain the difference between billing for a fire run versus billing for an EMS call, and expressed his support for the special assessment. Jeff White from Richmond Lenox EMS explained that the EMS is not involved with the first responder service. Mr. Mark Turo also inquired as to what the dollar amount was in regards to the first responder calls. Mr. Paul Mateik and Mrs. Roxy Mateik voiced their opposition to the special assessment. Mr. Toby Hutchinson inquired as to what the process would be to raise the cost of the special assessment, and also inquired about making the township hall ADA compliant. Mr. Aaron Titus inquired as to what the cost is for the residents who utilize the first responder service and receive a bill from the township. Mrs. Nancy Dudek inquired about people who have received a bill, and whether their bill would be forgiven if the special assessment passes, and she also asked if there was a timeline as to how often the special assessment would be renewed. Mr. Jerry Fillion inquired as to whether the township could charge by the household, rather than by the taxable value of the property. Mr. Doug Okorowski and Mrs. Deanna Okorowski voiced their opposition to the special assessment, and had also written a letter to the township expressing their opposition. Mr. David Burgess had written a letter to the Township Board expressing that he was opposed to the special assessment. Mr. Ronald Page and Mrs. Joanne Page sent an email to the board members expressing their support. Mrs. Deborah Kreuger voiced her support for the special assessment, and had also written a letter to the board members stating that she is in full support of the special assessment.
